# Palm Sunday

**21** Jesus and his followers were coming closer to Jerusalem. But first they stopped at Bethphage at the hill called the Mount of Olives. From there Jesus sent two of his followers into the town. <sup>2</sup>He said to them, "Go to the town you can see there. When you enter it, you will find a donkey tied there with its colt. Untie them and bring them to me. <sup>3</sup>If anyone asks you why you are taking the donkeys, tell him, 'The Master needs them. He will send them back soon.'" <sup>4</sup>This was to make clear the full meaning of what the prophet said:

<sup>5</sup> "Tell the people of Jerusalem,

'Your king is coming to you.





He is gentle and riding on a donkey.

He is on the colt of a donkey.""

<sup>6</sup>The followers went and did what Jesus told them to do. <sup>7</sup>They brought the donkey and the colt to Jesus. They laid their coats on the donkeys, and Jesus sat on them. <sup>8</sup>Many people spread their coats on the road before Jesus. Others cut branches from the trees and spread them on the road. <sup>9</sup>Some of the people were walking ahead of Jesus. Others were walking behind him. All the people were shouting,

"Hosanna to the Son of David! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord! Praise to God in heaven!"

<sup>10</sup> Then Jesus went into Jerusalem. The city was filled with excitement. The people asked, "Who is this man?"

<sup>11</sup>The crowd answered, "This man is Jesus. He is the prophet from the town of Nazareth in Galilee."

# Questions to ask:

- 1) Which part of the story did you like best and why?
- 2) Have you ever met or seen someone famous? What was the experience like?
- 3) Why do you think the crowd shouted 'Hosanna to the Son of David. Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord'. What do you think they meant? Why were they saying that about Jesus?
- 4) The people were desperate for peace in their land as they were ruled by the Romans and their armies. What from this passage about the Messiah do you think would have excited them?

# Explaining the Passage (adapt for younger children):

Today is Palm Sunday when we celebrate the entry of Jesus into Jerusalem. It was a day that marked the beginning of an incredible week. A week that would see Jesus cheered, then arrested, tried, condemned, and crucified.

Jesus had spent many months traveling through the towns and villages of Palestine where he had preached about the kingdom of God and performed many miracles. Now the time had come for him to claim his title as the Messiah - the Saviour that God had promised to the Jewish people. As they came near Jerusalem, Jesus told two of His disciples to go into a





nearby village and bring a donkey that would be waiting there. Jesus rode into Jerusalem on the donkey. It was obviously a deliberate act as there is no mention of Jesus ever riding on a donkey previously. Matthew makes clear that this move alludes to the prophecy in Zechariah 9 v 9-10 of the coming of the messianic king. The disciples and the crowd around them also recognized this and so turned the arrival of Jesus into a triumphant procession. The Messiah had arrived.

#### Prayer:

"God, we have so much to praise you for. Thank you for all that you have done for us. Help us to keep praising you even when times are difficult. Amen"

#### Game:

**Pin the Coat on the Donkey** – you could either print and use the pages at the end of this Family Activity Sheet or alternatively take a toy horse/pony/donkey and some material to use as the coat.
