Setting the scene

Dear friends, today we meet together to commemorate the 80th anniversary of the Allied Victory in Europe. It is a day of celebration, because it marks the end of a dark, sad time of death, destruction and division. So we are also mindful of our need for God's forgiveness for the desire to dominate others. A sin that leads to conflict between people, and war between nations. And as we remember the many soldiers, sailors, and air crew who gave their lives fighting evil and opposing tyranny, so we also give thanks for those who continue to strive for peace on this continent.

Like those who gathered on that first Victory day, we are glad of each other's company, and grateful for the laughter and love that follows times of sadness and loss. But above all things, we pray that God's will may be done on earth as it is in heaven, as we join our voices together and say:

Introduction

A light after the darkness

Later in our Bible reading this morning, Jesus is visiting the temple in Jerusalem. Like us in church this morning, he was there to celebrate a great feast day, called Hannukah. Hannukah was a festival of lights, when people remembered that a time of darkness had ended when the temple was rededicated to God. The eight lights of Hannukah reminded people of God's presence, protection and faithfulness.

This morning we too are remembering the end of a time of darkness, a time when the lights came back on all across Europe and to help us to celebrate that, we too will light three candles. For us they will be symbols of hope, resilience and freedom, a reminder that Jesus, is the true light of the world.

As we light the first candle, we give thanks for hope — the light that shines in darkness, a promise that better days will come.

Jesus, Light of the world, shine your hope in our hearts.

As we light the second candle, we remember resilience — the strength to keep going when times are hard, the courage to stand for what is right.

Jesus, Light of the world, shine your strength in our lives.

As we light the third candle, we celebrate freedom — the gift of peace and the power to choose love, the joy of living without fear.

Jesus, Light of the world, shine your freedom in our world.

Jesus, you are the light no darkness can overcome. Help us to carry your light of hope, strength, and freedom into every place we go. Amen.

Saying sorry

It is much, much easier to get lost in the darkness than it is to get lost in the light. Often when we talk about times of war and conflict, we talk about lost generations or lost years, or about the loss of goodness, or the loss of youth. Sometimes we get lost because, we have no choice but to follow paths that are full of danger. Sometimes we get lost because we choose not to listen to trusted guides. Those like Jesus who protect and care for us, wherever we may wander.

Jesus says we are like sheep — and he is our shepherd. He knows us. He never loses us. And no one can snatch us away from him — not even war, fear, or sadness. So let us say sorry for the times when we lose sight of him or ignore his guidance.

Loving God, We are sorry for the times we've wandered away from you. When we've been lost in worry, in anger, or in fear. Thank you that you never give up on us. Help us to listen for your voice and trust your way.

Loving God, forgive us and help us.

Jesus, our Shepherd, We are sorry for the times we've gone our own way, when we thought we knew better, and didn't follow your loving lead. Forgive us, and bring us back to your safe path.

Loving God, forgive us and help us.

God of peace, We are sorry for the brokenness in our world— for the times we forget to love, for the hurt we cause, and the voices we ignore. Lead us back to goodness, to kindness, and to you.

Loving God, forgive us and help us.

Jesus said, "My sheep listen to my voice... I give them eternal life, and they shall never perish; no one can snatch them out of my hand." So we can be sure: Even when we wander, God's love finds us. Even when we fail, God's grace forgives us. Even when we're afraid, God's hand holds us fast. In Jesus Christ, we are forgiven.

Then came the Feast of Hanukkah at Jerusalem. It was winter. Jesus was in the temple courtyard walking in Solomon's Porch. The Jews who were gathered there around Jesus spoke to him. They said, "How long will you keep us waiting? If you are the Messiah, tell us plainly."

Jesus answered, "I did tell you. But you do not believe. The works that I do in my Father's name are a witness for me. But you do not believe, because you are not my sheep.
