water and the Spirit
we give you thanks and praise.

For your grace bestowed upon us your
children, washing away our sins
we give you thanks and praise.

So, Father, accept our sacrifice of praise.
By the power of your life-giving Spirit
bless these waters of your new creation.
Lord, receive our prayer.

May we your servants who have been
washed in them be made one with your
Son, who took the form of a servant.
Lord, receive our prayer.

May your Holy Spirit, who has brought us
to new birth in the family of your Church,
raise us in Christ, our anointed Lord,
to full and eternal life.

For all might, majesty and dominion are
yours, now and for ever.
