First Reading

1 Chronicles 29 : 6—16

⁶ Then the leaders of families, the
officers of the tribes of Israel, the
commanders of thousands and
commanders of hundreds, and the
officials in charge of the king's work
gave willingly. ⁷ They gave towards the
work on the temple of God five
thousand talents and ten thousand
darics of gold, ten thousand talents of
silver, eighteen thousand talents of
bronze and a hundred thousand
talents of iron. ⁸ Anyone who had
precious stones gave them to the
treasury of the temple of the LORD in
the custody of Jehiel the Gershonite.
⁹ The people rejoiced at the willing
response of their leaders, for they had
given freely and wholeheartedly to
the LORD. David the king also rejoiced
greatly.

¹⁰ David praised the LORD in the presence of the whole assembly, saying, 'Praise be to you, LORD, the God of our father Israel, from everlasting to everlasting.

¹¹ Yours, LORD, is the greatness and the power and the glory and the majesty and the splendour, for everything in heaven and earth is yours. Yours, LORD, is the kingdom; you are exalted as head over all.

¹² Wealth and honour come from you; you are the ruler of all things. In your hands are strength and power to exalt and give strength to all.

¹³ Now, our God, we give you thanks, and praise your glorious name.

¹⁴ 'But who am I, and who are my people, that we should be able to give as generously as this? Everything comes from you, and we have given you only what comes from your hand.

¹⁵ We are foreigners and strangers in your sight, as were all our ancestors. Our days on earth are like a shadow, without hope. ¹⁶ LORD our God, all this abundance that we have provided for building you a temple for your Holy Name comes from your hand, and all of it belongs to you.

John 6 : 1—13

¹Some time after this, Jesus crossed to the far shore of the Sea of Galilee (that is, the Sea of Tiberias), ²and a great crowd of people followed him because they saw the signs he had performed by healing the sick. ³Then Jesus went up on a mountainside and sat down with his disciples. ⁴The Jewish Passover Festival was near.

⁵ When Jesus looked up and saw a great crowd coming toward him, he said to Philip, "Where shall we buy bread for these people to eat?" ⁶ He asked this only to test him, for he already had in mind what he was going to do.

⁷ Philip answered him, "It would take more than half a year's wages to buy enough bread for each one to have a bite!"

⁸ Another of his disciples, Andrew, Simon Peter's brother, spoke up, ⁹ "Here is a boy with five small barley loaves and two small fish, but how far will they go among so many?"

¹⁰ Jesus said, "Have the people sit down." There was plenty of grass in that place, and they sat down (about five thousand men were there). ¹¹ Jesus then took the loaves, gave thanks, and distributed to those who were seated as much as they wanted. He did the same with the fish.

¹² When they had all had enough to eat, he said to his disciples, "Gather the pieces that are left over. Let nothing be wasted."

¹³ So they gathered them and filled twelve baskets with the pieces of the five barley loaves left over by those who had eaten.
