Listening to God's Word

First Reading — Acts 1:6-11

While the apostles were still with Jesus, they asked him:

'Lord, are you now going to give Israel its own king again?'

Jesus said to them:

'You don't need to know the time of those events that only the Father controls. But the Holy Spirit will come upon you and give you power. Then you will tell everyone about me in Jerusalem, in all Judea, in Samaria, and everywhere in the world.'

After Jesus had said this and while they were watching, he was taken up into a cloud. They could not see him, but as he went up, they kept looking up into the sky. Suddenly two men dressed in white clothes were standing there beside them. They said:

Why are you men from Galilee standing here and looking up into the sky? Jesus has been taken to heaven.

But he will come back in the same way that you have seen him go.'

The Eucharistic Prayer

The Lord is here.

Why is it right to give thanks and praise?

2nd voice

1st voice

Why do we share this bread and wine?

2nd voice

Because Jesus makes them signs of his love.

On the night before he died, when darkness had fallen, Jesus took bread. He gave thanks, broke it, and shared it with his disciples. 'This is my body', he said, 'given for you.

Do this to remember me.'

After they had eaten, he took the cup, gave thanks, and shared wine with his disciples. 'This is my blood,' he said, 'poured out for you and for all people, to save them from their sins.

Do this to remember me.'

Father, with this bread and this cup we celebrate his love, his death, his risen life. As you feed us with these gifts send your Holy Spirit, and change us more and more to be like Jesus our Saviour.

1st voice

Why do we follow Jesus Christ?

2nd voice

Because he is God's saving love.

Help us to love one another, and to work together for that day when the whole world is fed, suffering is ended, and all creation is gathered in your loving arms.

And now with Lawrence, Paul and all your saints we give you glory, through Jesus Christ, in the strength of the Spirit, today and for ever.


