On Easter Sunday we also said farewell to Paul Warren performing in his official capacity as our Organist and Choir Director. Confirmation Course 2025





GETTING TO KNOW YOU - Karen Au.

Dear readers, it is my great pleasure to introduce myself to you as your new organist. Here is a bit of background information about where I've been and what I've done -

I was born in Hong Kong in 1990, and like many middle class Asian children, I was made to learn the piano at age seven. After hearing the violin on the streets of Canterbury I also asked (or more like pestered) my parents to let me learn the violin as well.

When I arrived in the UK to embark on secondary education my new piano teacher, a terrifying but inspiring man, happened to be the school

organist and after a couple of years he decided that he'd teach me the organ instead. Soon after that, I began to play for school services and even took over as school organist in my final year at school. To my amazement I managed to gain an organ scholarship at Corpus Christi, Cambridge, where for three years I attempted (and failed miserably) to write many essays and play three services a week. Despite the stressful environment, due to the constant overwhelming workload, I mostly enjoyed my time there and learnt a lot about choral accompanying.

After university, I was briefly the organist of St Lawrence's College in Ramsgate before moving on to another organ scholarship at Blackburn Cathedral. I very quickly realised that I did not suit the world of cathedral music, nor it me, so after I completed my year as organ scholar I decided to earn a living as a baker but also working as a freelance musician, doing some teaching and playing for various local Choral Societies and churches.

Recently, I decided I'd had enough of the night shifts and decided to re-train as a horticulturalist. Having spent two and a bit years inside a hot stuffy bakery all night working outside in the fresh air seemed very appealing. Currently I work at Willowbridge Plants, a nursery in Catforth, which specialises in grafted Japanese Maples.

Now that you know a bit about me, I look forward to getting to know all of you over the next few months. I am hoping that I can build on what Paul Warren has achieved and continue to raise the standard of worship and music at St. Lawrence with St. Paul. If you are interested in joining the choir either as a regular member or on a more ad hoc basis please don't hesitate to get in touch, you will be able to catch me most Sundays!



When Simon and Tracy arrived back from the Ordination Service at the Cathedral, where he was made Deacon on the 4th July 2021, the original plan was to have a Garden Party at the Old Vicarage to welcome them but as it turned out Covid restrictions were such that the garden party was postponed until the September and only the PCC were able to be there.

We didn't waste much time before throwing things at him though because when that Garden Party did take place we had him in the stocks, wet through, from being hit by wet sponges! Being soaked was perhaps good preparation for the 21 miles he swam in 21 days, (a total of 1344 lengths of a local swimming pool), as part of the Time, Talents and Treasures Triathlon in August 2023 raising money for church funds. That challenge was all the more remarkable because Simon had undergone a hip replacement operation earlier that year.

When Simon returned to the Cathedral to be Priested on Saturday 2nd July, 2022 he was not short of Longridge support and after the Service came back to St. Paul's for a celebratory BBQ and party with everyone invited. It was amazing that in just 12 months in the Parish it felt like he was one of us.

Over the four years we have had the privilege of having Simon as Curate there have been of course many baptisms, weddings and far too many funerals, every one of those occasional offices prepared with the utmost care. We should add that there have also been some long PCC Agendas to work through with many fabric and finance items to discuss but when Revd. Mike took his three month sabbatical in 2024 he knew the parish was in good hands.

What a journey we have shared and now that journey will take Simon and Tracy ten miles or so back down the B6243 towards Preston and on to Penwortham with our love and prayers.

One thing Simon you leave with one record intact – you are the only Vicar or Curate of Longridge, certainly in living memory, who has received a spontaneous round of applause after a sermon - quite an achievement but what a gift you have for preaching.



The Log The Last Word

From the Vicar, Rev. Mike Barton



Just over four years ago and before Revd Simon was ordained, I walked with him around Longridge while we both discerned if this could be a suitable place for him to train to be a vicar. As I introduced him to the parish one particular leadership maxim was going through my mind, 'Competence is trainable. Character is essential.'

In fairness to Revd Simon, it was evident that he already had stacks of competence from his previous professional career, and over the four years of his ministry here I've probably learnt more from him that he has from me. However, the question I was discerning – and I'm sure he was of me was

what was his character like?

You only need to look at the present chaos of worldly affairs and inconsistent leadership to know character is key. So now Revd Simon is shortly to move with his family to be the vicar of St Leonard's Penwortham, I'm reminded of the phrase, 'virtue's hunt in packs'. This is to say, just as wolves or lions hunt best when they team up together, so a person's virtues are made stronger when they align as one. Such a person could be said to have positively consistent character.

This is what I have observed in Revd Simon and is celebrated in some of the words and pictures within this edition of The Log.

This is why the Apostle Paul talks about the 'fruit' of the Spirit, rather than the 'fruits' of the Spirit in Galatians 5.22. The virtues of love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness and self-control are meant to be part of one interconnected fruit of Christlike character, not individual fruits of varying size grown in separate isolation.

So if a person tells you their growing in joy but we observe them becoming less kind, we note an alarming contradiction and question the integrity of their 'pick n' mix' character. But when a person truly welcomes the presence of Jesus in their life, the Holy Spirit transforms everything, it affects every part of the fruit.

This is the way of life Revd Simon has accepted and when we do so our character is continually tested, especially in leadership. And because we're only human, inevitably sometimes we'll fall. But the character God forms will find the courage to rise again, even more dependent on the knowledge of God's grace.

So as Revd Simon and his family plant themselves in a new place, may the fruit of God's Spirit within them be evident to all. I pray they'll be blessed to discover lots of other fine characters in Penwortham, and I trust you will too.
